WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF WE LIVE WITHOUT RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF TIME?

“To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven” (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

Time, period, and moments are gifts bestowed upon us by the Lord. It is significant to not waste them because the Lord will only knock on our door to warn us once. In that moment, we must be vigilant and utilise our time wisely. If we slumber and miss the Lord's reminders, there will be no one to remind us again. Therefore, it's essential for each of us needs to cultivate an awareness of time.

Not everyone in the Bible, including forefathers, kings, judges, prophets, and ordinary women, fully utilised the moments which were given to them. While some utilised their time wisely, others remained indifferent. However, God loved them and corrected them by explaining the importance of time, guiding them towards understanding the significance of time and offering correction when needed.

I. Those who Wasted Time:

Cain - failed to keep the precious time spoken by God.

Jacob - wasted 14 years in Laban's household pursuing Rachel.

Samson - deviated from the Lord's Nazarene fast due to Delilah, resulting in lost time.

Saul - forsaking his kingship, chose to follow only David.

Haman - failed to honour the trust bestowed upon him by King Ahasuerus.

Lot's wife - failed to utilize the divine moment which was instructed by the Lord.

The thief – He was crucified alongside Jesus but lost the time given to him.

Gehazi - The one who strayed from the path of the Prophet (Elisha) by forming a new connection with Naaman and did not keep the time given to him.

Judas - The individual who traded his loyalty for thirty pieces of silver and died

Who are we? - We are the ones wasting all our time.

From the names listed above, we will only discuss about two individuals: Haman and Gehazi.

Haman and Gehazi are notable examples of individuals who betrayed their respective authorities. Haman faced execution by the king's decree, while Gehazi suffered from leprosy after being cursed by the prophet Elisha.

II. Agagite in the Court of the Kingdom of Susa

“After these events, King Ahasuerus honoured Haman son of Hammedatha, the Agagite, elevating him and giving him a seat of honour higher than that of all the other nobles.” (Esther 3:1)

The book of Esther demonstrates that God's plan cannot be stopped. Esther, whose name means "planet Venus," was guided by her guardian Mordecai despite lacking parents. The meaning of the name Mordecai is a small person.

Haman is labelled an Agagite because "Agag" denotes a lineage of the Amalekite kings (1 Samuel 15:8). The term "Agagite" signifies a faction within the Amalekites, who historically clashed with the Israelites, this was the reason for Haman's motive to kill the Jews.

The King elevated Haman above all others so all the servants, employees, and those in high positions bowed down to him. While everyone in the palace and court obeyed Haman's commands, the action of the man in charge of guarding the palace gate infuriated Haman. He inquired about Mordecai's lineage and learned that he belonged to the Jewish clan.

A. Haman's First Plan - Distraught the Mind of King Ahasuerus

King Ahasuerus ruled over a vast empire comprising 127 kingdoms. Susa was the winter palace of Persian kings. No other king mentioned in the Bible controlled such an extensive territory. How did Haman change the heart of such a great King?

Haman said to the king, "In your land, there are individuals from diverse backgrounds with varying customs who do not adhere to the king's laws." He also suggests that the king should issue a decree to eradicate them and offer to contribute a significant sum to the treasury for

the destruction of the Israelites. He proposes this out of his own self-interest and prejudice against the Israelites. The king's decision to heed Haman's advice without consulting his advisors highlights his ignorance and lack of discernment. One should not depend entirely on those who praise oneself.

A king's authority is symbolised by his signet ring. It reflects the king's lack of discernment to grant the signet ring without thorough investigation. Let us pray for such individuals, as stated in 1 Timothy 2:1-3, which encourages us to make petitions, prayers, supplications, and praises for kings and all those in positions of authority.

1. What is a signet ring?

The king's emblem was intricately crafted, fashioned from pure gold. In the land, any decree issued by the king required the official seal from the ring to be affixed at the bottom of the document and on the envelope. Consider the consequences if this precious ring were to fall into the wrong hands and how it would alter the fate of the people.

B. Haman's Second Plan

"...Dispatches were sent by couriers to all the king's provinces with the order to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews..."(Esther 3:13)

We must avoid hasty actions that could backfire on us. There's no history of animosity between Haman and Mordecai. Haman's fierce hatred towards the Jewish people stemmed from his own narcissism, as he couldn't bear

their refusal to worship him. Upon obtaining the signet ring, Haman's pride, envy, and arrogance led him to believe he wielded power over the entire empire, even seeing King Ahasuerus as subordinate. His disregard for God's laws marks him as a ruthless murderer.

He quickly wrote as the king Ahasuerus wrote, stamped the government symbol with a seal ring, and ordered the messengers to take it to all the nations. His anger at Mordecai turned into a wrath. He acted according to the saying, ***"A wrathful man never wants woe"***.

C. Haman's Third Plan

Haman's wife and his friend Everyone looked at Haman and said to him, ***"Have a pole set up, reaching to a height of fifty cubits, and ask the king in the morning to have Mordecai impaled on it..." (Esther 5:14).***

Job's wife looked at Job and said: ***"Are you still maintaining your integrity? Curse God and die!" (Job 2:9)***

It's commonly said that behind every successful man is a woman, often his wife. However, let us think about the stories of Haman's and Job's wives regarding this. Proverbs 14:1 highlights the impact of a wise woman in building her home. Jacob's wives, too, played important roles in supporting him, from naming their children to their shared fear of God, this showcases the varied roles and influences wives can have in various situations.

Here, in Haman's story, we witness how in the height of his hatred, his wife and friends fuelled his anger further, leading to the order for

Mordecai's execution on poles. It serves as a reminder that neither family members nor friends should incite hatred or provoke others against each other.

D. Haman's Final Decision

"So they impaled Haman on the pole he had set up for Mordecai. Then the king's fury subsided." Esther 7:10)

After witnessing Haman falling onto the mattress where Esther sat, the king became enraged, suspecting that Haman intended to harm the queen. Just then, the king's servant, Harbonah, informed him about the gallows that Haman had prepared for Mordecai, who had once saved the king's life. Without any hesitation, the king commanded Haman to be hanged on the very pole he had erected. Haman met his fate, and the Jews were saved from harm.

Your actions will have consequences. Those who entertain violence will face violence. Evil begets evil. As the proverb says, ***"Whoever digs a pit will fall into it, and a stone will come back on whoever rolls it" (Proverbs 26:27).*** Haman's life serves as a lesson for everyone. If we fear the Lord, we can trust that He will lift us to safety at the appointed time.

III. The servant of prophet Elisha:

"Don't be afraid," the prophet answered. "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them" (2 Kings 6:16).

In the Old Testament, we encounter

numerous prophets like Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Nathan, Ananias, Samuel, and many more. When Elijah asked Elisha what he desired, Elisha's request for a double portion of Elijah's spirit set on him. Elisha proved to be an exceptional prophet by not only seeking blessings but also expanding and continuing Elijah's ministry. He performed many miracles. Gehazi is the servant of such a servant of God.

A. What kind of person is this Gehazi?

He resided with the prophet Elisha, witnessing first-hand all the miracles Elisha performed. He provided steadfast assistance to Elisha whenever needed, and under Elisha's guidance, he grew into a strong believer.

Once, there was a war between the king of Israel and the king of Syria. The Lord, who revealed secrets to Elisha, informed him of the Syrian army's movements. Hearing this, the king of Syria sent his cavalry, chariots, and a strong army to surround the city where Elisha resided. When Gehazi, Elisha's servant, saw this in the morning, he was afraid. Elisha then prayed to the Lord to open Gehazi's spiritual eyes. When Gehazi's eyes were opened, he saw the great fiery protection the Lord had placed around Elisha.

Even though Gehazi witnessed such wonders and miracles through his master, he strayed onto the wrong path without Elisha's knowledge, driven by desires that arose in his mind.

B. Gehazi's First Mistake: Lying.

“Therefore each of you must put off

falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbour, for we are all members of one body.” (Ephesians 4:25)

Telling a lie often leads to telling more lies to cover it up. It's better to avoid lying altogether. The Apostle Paul advises not just the Ephesian church but all of us to speak the truth to one another.

Gehazi told Naaman that his master had sent him to ask for a talent of silver and two changes of clothes. Gehazi, having witnessed numerous miracles and wonders first-hand, could have approached Elisha for what he needed. Instead, he committed the unforgivable sin of blaming his master and taking material goods from Naaman.

C. The Second Mistake Gehazi Made: Hiding.

Gehazi hid the goods purchased from Naaman in his house. He initially asked for one share, but Naaman gave him twice as much. His first mistake was falsely claiming that his master had sent him. His second mistake was concealing the goods in his house without anyone's knowledge. His third mistake was lying to Elisha about his whereabouts when asked.

Elisha, being God's servant, knew Gehazi well. He was extremely displeased that Gehazi had acted without trust and had forgotten God who had supported and protected him through numerous trials.

He was cursed by his master for his deed, neglecting to use his time for the Lord, which

displeased the Lord. The leprosy that had afflicted Naaman now gripped Gehazi, turning him into a leper with skin as white as snow, and he departed from Elisha's presence.

IV. How we utilise the time

Mr. Paramanandam Iyer, who preached in church, has clearly written about how we should live by understanding the significance of time.

Do you know what happened to Ananias at the end of the time that Jeremiah prophesied(Jeremiah 28:15-17)?

Have you ever been caught unprepared, thinking that time is entirely yours?

Time swiftly passes, never pausing for us. Let us heed Jesus Christ's words to watch and pray. Today is the day of salvation. Reflecting on King David's life, David sings, "My soul overflows with praise to the Lord, who has been with me in every circumstance, even from childhood loneliness."

Haman was elevated to the highest position next to the king, but he squandered his

time by engaging in evil deeds. His thoughts, memories, and actions were all tainted by evil. He showed no gratitude for his promotion. Time did not wait for Haman. If we conspire against others, similar consequences may befall us.

Gehazi lived a remarkable life that few can experience, living alongside a prophet. This opportunity was a grace beyond imagination. Simply stating the truth and seeking forgiveness would have been sufficient. However, Gehazi failed to utilize the time wisely. A lying tongue is detestable to the Lord, as evidenced by the fate of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts Chapter 5). Time is invaluable; once it passes, it does not return.

For what purpose does the Lord give us each moment? Let us choose to forgive and forget the mistakes of others. It is by the pure grace of God that we have lived for so many years. To remain in this grace, let us use our time to do something for God. Amen.
