Faith By Itself - Without Works is Dead (James 2:14-24).

I would like to start off by giving you a simple equation. Success in life comes from the following equation,

Faith + Works = Success in Life.

The opposite of this also applies,

Faith-Works or Works-Faith = Failure in Life.

If we examine the life of Christians, we see two extremes in them.

1. The first group of Christians are those who are far removed from the world, they live in a kind of **spiritual bubble** of false righteousness. They do not mix with unbelievers, because they are afraid of doing things that doesn't, please God. The sad thing is that these Christians do not share the gospel with an unbelieving world, they live in an enclosed space.

These Christians have some peculiar characteristics:

- These Christians are like a light under a table which of course, is not good.
- They tend to be very religious and their God is morality.
- These Christians are well behaved and if their children are well behaved too, they feel they have made it in life.
- These Christians focus on the do's of Christianity.
- 2. The other type of Christians are those who are so assimilated/ immense with the

world, that you can't even tell if they are Christians. They are the Christians in Ephesus, Pergamum or Sardis.

Their characteristics are:

- They think they are light in the world, but no one would know it.
- They speak of grace, of justification, of salvation, but they know very little about these and practically nothing about sanctification.
- Friends, sanctification is the <u>work of</u>
 <u>Christ in us</u>, and it is <u>not our work</u>.
 Sanctification demands our <u>total surrender</u> to Christ.
- These Christians call themselves "Gospel centered" or "Christ centered", and they bank or depend on Christ's grace in a distorted way, because the way they live, the way they do things when no one is watching, their testimony, it stains or blots out the very grace of God that saved them.
- Friends, to be honest, these Christians tend to live for themselves, and they do not know the mission that God has for them.

We Christians are taught to be like Jesus, to be Christ like in our behavior, but if we compare these Christians with Jesus, we know that they are far away from Jesus, Jesus was full of grace. He never took his eyes off God, the Father and the mission that God had for Him. Jesus did not allow this world to distract the very purpose for which He was sent to earth.

Jesus (in John 17:4) speaks to God the Father and says: "Father, I Glorified you in earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do."

- Jesus knew exactly what He needed to do and that's exactly what He did in His short life on earth.
- Friends, God is posting the same question to us today:

<u>Do you know what you are supposed to do in this short life and are you actually doing it?</u>

Are we walking on the good works God has laid out in front of us to walk in, so that people will see our good works and glorify the Father? Or, are we banking on grace, yet living however the way we want to?

Grace, my friends is unconditional love, but this true love demands a response. Let us put it this way:

Grace is like your one-and-a-half-yearold child who is just learning to walk and as soon as you home from work, this beautiful little child approaches you with arms wide open, waiting to hug you, with a beautiful smile on his face.

- This little child represents pure love coming your way. This is grace. It is pure love and it demands a response. It requires you to leave behind whatever you are doing and carry your child.
- Likewise, if you say you have faith in Christ or if you have rested in Christ, but have No work, No response, No action- **YOUR FAITH IS DEAD!**

• So, therefore, James 2:17 states clearly, "So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

Friends, the Word of God reminds us today that:

"The Work of Christ for us starts a work in us."

Again, this topic is difficult, because we know that we are not saved by works, not even good works, we are saved by the Grace of Christ alone.

- When Jesus said, "It is finished", it was finished! There is nothing we can add to the work of salvation. But you see that salvation doesn't come void or absent of good works, for us to walk in (Eph 2:10).
- Friends, justification is just not a pardon; justification is just not God saying, "You may go, your sentence has been paid, you may go." Justification is God saying, "You are forgiven, yes because of that you may come unto Me." It is at this point, that God's kingdom comes into our life, His will be done, not ours.

Let's go a little further:

In this scripture portion in James 2 vs 14-24 we see two kinds of faith that are not true faith. The first kind of faith is,

1. A Dead Faith

James 2: 14-16 says, "What good is it, my brothers if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him?

- Can a faith that is voided or absent from works, save us? Please keep this question in mind. James now lays out a few scenarios for us. "If a brother or a sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food" (verse 15).
- Would you say to your brother or sister, "Go in peace: God bless you; don't worry, when God closes a door, He'll open another; I'm sure God has great things for you; be blessed, trust God; I'll be praying for you... and the list goes on (verse16).

In reality what James is saying, "God has already provided a coat for them; it's the one you are wearing, GIVE IT TO YOUR BROTHER OR SISTER IN NEED."

You know that something that is dead does **NOTHING**, likewise, dead faith does **NOTHING**.

- Dead faith is basically lip service. It is lip service that is voided of a living sacrifice (that is, instead of giving your coat, you say a lot of things and do nothing).
- Dead faith is professing faith you actually cannot practice, because though you profess it, you don't possess it, because it is deadagain, I say it, because it's dead faith.
- Friends, I think God wants to search our hearts through this passage.

We live in a culture that values comfort over sacrifice. We have to be careful not to take the Gospel message of trusting and resting in Jesus and incorrectly adapting it for our convenience.

- Jesus says, "He who abides in me will bear My fruit for without Me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). What or who do we abide in? Jesus gives us life and rest and also joy when we do His will.
- The second kind of faith that James describes is a faith that is NOT different to that for the demons. Allow me to say something, "Even the demons believe in Jesus". How is a belief in Jesus different to a belief the demons have? Well, that would be to:
- Believe in Jesus and do nothing for Him.
- o Believe in Jesus and hush the Gospel.
- Believe in Jesus and live for yourself.
- We believe in Jesus but our lifestyle does not reflect our love for Him(Jesus).
- If we read the gospels of Mathew, Mark, Luke and John, we see that the demons know Jesus well and even have a great theology about Him. In Mark 1:34, we read, "And He(Jesus) would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew Him". So, we see the demons knew Jesus well.
- In the synagogues, there was a man who had the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice, "Ha! What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth, have you come to destroy us? I know who you are-The Holy One of God" (Luke 4:34).
- Likewise in Luke 4:33-34 says, many people can even say what this demon said, "Jesus, you are the Holy One of God."

- Luke 4:41 we read, And demons also came out of many saying, "You are the Son of God! But he rebuked them and would not allow them to speak, because they knew that He was the Christ."
- The demons have a good theology or good knowledge about Jesus, but they do NOT LOVE Jesus. They do not have any affection for Jesus. Their belief in Jesus is not true faith at all.

So, friends we now know that there is a kind of faith that is like the one the demons believe in. It is not True Faith. Would you allow God now to search your heart and lead you to repentance?

Who and what does your life revolve around?

- Do you have true faith in Jesus Christ? Is He real to you every day?
- A belief in Jesus Christ like the demons has information but lacks transformation.
- Friends, true faith always leads you to action. Jesus has done all the work for our salvation, but that salvation comes

accompanied with goods works for us to walk in.

In conclusion, I would to draw an analogy to Abraham, In James 2:21 we read, "Wasn't our ancestor Abraham, made right with God by works" when he placed his son Isaac on the sacrificial altar? Isn't it obvious that faith and works are yoked partners, that faith expresses itself in works? That the works are "works of faith". The full meaning of "believe" in the scripture sentence, Abraham believed God and was set right with God, includes his action. It is that mix of believing and acting that got Abraham his name, "God's friend". Is it not clear that a person is made right with God, not by a barren faith but by faith that is fruitful in works!

Finally, once again I'd like to go back to remind you of the equation that I mentioned earlier,

Faith + Works = Success in Life.

There is a great need for more promotional staff and representatives in many places. Let us pray for dedicated young people to join the IBT ministry and for translators to be available for new languages.

Is Anger an Inherited Property or a Disease?

When someone displays anger, some people proudly claim, "This temper is our ancestral trait." This is not just superstition—it is sheer foolishness. Instead of using inherited anger as an excuse, we should treat this hereditary flaw as a red warning signal and strive to control our temper.

For instance, if diseases like heart conditions, arthritis, or joint pain run in the family, what do we do? We warn the next generation and advise them to take preventive measures to avoid such illnesses.

Two young women, Rani and Mary, were having a conversation. Rani observed Mary and said,"I have noticed that you are always patient and never get angry. How do you manage to stay so calm? What's your secret?"Mary responded: "Rani, in my family, anger and stubbornness have been passed down for generations. My grandfather, in his rage, hit my grandmother so severely that she became permanently disabled. Until their last breath, my grandparents never spoke to each other again.

Similarly, my father, when enraged, would beat my mother so brutally that she would be left bruised and swollen. Whenever my father approached our street corner, all the children would run and hide in fear.

Since both my grandfather and father belonged to this lineage of anger, I decided from a young age that I would not become a victim of this inherited temper. Whenever I felt anger rising within me, I would remind myself of my grandfather, who left my grandmother disabled for life, and my mother, who lived in constant fear of my father.

Not only that, one day, I surrendered myself to the Lord and prayed, 'Jesus, anger is my hereditary disease. Instead of me trying to control my anger, I surrender myself to Your control.' From that day onward, my anger has never resurfaced. In every situation, I remain patient. That is the secret of my patience," Mary testified to her friend Rani.

What an incredible, experience-based, and practical testimony! And it comes from a 20-year-old woman. If you are someone who struggles with anger, please do not justify it. If your anger flares up like fire, remember—before it reaches the ground, there is a high chance it may turn into lightning or a thunderstorm.

Then anger blinds you, you become blind to reason. Only after your anger subsides do you realize how foolish your words were. One of the best ways to prevent anger is to remain silent when you feel it rising. If you go to bed with anger, the devil sleeps beside you.

Did you know how the Roman Emperor Julius Caesar controlled his anger? Whenever he felt angry, he would start reciting the Roman alphabet: A, B, C, D... By the time he reached X, Y, Z, his anger would have disappeared. You, too, can follow Julius Caesar's method when you feel angry.

Be not hasty in thy spirit to be angry: for anger resteth in the bosom of fools (Ecclesiastes 7:9).

He that is slow to anger is better than the mighty; and he that ruleth his spirit than he that taketh a city (Proverbs 16:32).

Some People Get Angry Instantly.

A woman went to her pastor and complained about her husband:

"Pastor, my husband is a terrible man. He spends his nights outside and never comes home. Even if he does, he comes back drunk. His behavior is causing a lot of trouble for our children. Whenever he sees me, he slams the door shut and leaves. You must talk some sense into him," she lamented.

The pastor knew a bit about their family background. He understood that the reason her husband stayed away from home and had turned into an alcoholic was her short temper. She had a habit of constantly finding faults, getting angry over trivial matters, and being perpetually grumpy. Hearing this, the woman flared up, stood up abruptly, and snapped, "No need! Neither your prayers nor you are required!" She then stormed out, slamming the door behind her as if hitting the pastor with it.

Who is willing to acknowledge their own faults? How about you? Stop constantly blaming the people in your home. Don't focus on the speck in someone else's eye while ignoring the beam in your own.

- The President's rule was implemented in the north-eastern state of Manipur on 13.02.2025. The state assembly has been suspended. While the BJP government, led by N. Biren Singh, was in power in Manipur, has resigned from the chief minister's position on 09.02.2025.
