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THE LORD MAKES A WAY - II



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INTRODUCTION

In the first part of this article, we talked about God's deliverance for His children when they pass through the Red Sea and the River Jordan. In this article we will consider other possible situations through which we as Christians may pass through. We can take courage that the Lord can always provide a way and sustain us till we reach the heavenly shores. Let us always trust Him, wait on Him and be totally surrendered to His ways and in the end, we will find out the truth of what He said, "I will never leave you or forsake you."

THROUGH THE WILDERNESS

The first test came to the children of Israel when they were 3 days into the journey after they crossed the Red Sea. They came to the waters of Mara which was bitter and they complained about it to Moses. The Lord showed Moses a tree, and Moses cast it into the waters and the bitter waters became sweet. The Lord also gave them a wonderful promise in **Ex 15:26** *"And said, If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee."* Let us now see the working of the Lord through the wilderness experience of the children of Israel.

- **PRESERVED FROM THIRST**
(Ex 15: 23-27)

It must have been a difficult situation. The wilderness is bad enough because the environment is barren of any good life. In the midst of the dry land, they found water which was bitter to drink. BUT there was a miracle that only God can perform. He turned the bitter into sweet. If you are passing through a wilderness, expect bitterness along the way, but turn your attention to the Lord and He will surely make a way to turn it into sweetness. Jesus went through the bitterness of the cross, but He cried out "Father, into Thy hands I commend My Spirit". This bitterness turned out into sweetness as He rose and came out from the grave. The sadness of the disciples turned into joy when they saw their Lord again. If you are passing through some bitterness, may the Lord turn it to sweetness and bring joy into your soul again. The Lord's blessing did not stop there, but He brought them to the abundance of Elim. (**Exodus 15:27** *"And they came to Elim, where were twelve wells of water, and threescore and ten palm trees: and they encamped there by the waters."*)

- **PRESERVED FROM HUNGER**
(Ex 16:1-36)

The children of Israel did not cease to murmur. In fact, they forgot the 400 years of bondage and hard labor under the Egyptians. God's deliverance not only brought freedom

and liberty to them, but the Egyptians themselves were destroyed by the plagues including the loss of all the firstborn in their household (including Pharaoh's house). Even though they saw the powerful and mighty hand of God in their liberation, they wanted to go back to slavery in Egypt (**Ex 16: 3** "***And the children of Israel said unto them, Would to God we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the flesh pots, and when we did eat bread to the full; for ye have brought us forth into this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger.***")

If we could just pause for a moment about the murmurings of the children of Israel, after, their deliverance, God did not abandon them, but took on the responsibility of leading them through the wilderness. He was leading them towards the promised land which God had described as the 'land flowing with milk and honey.' Are you content with the blessing that God has provided for you? You probably have a job, salary, family, friendships, home to live in etc. Or like the children of Israel, grumbling and murmuring and dissatisfied that you wish you had a more luxurious home, car etc. There is an old grumbler's song whose lyrics is as below:

*Oh they!! Grumble on a Monday, Tuesday,
Wednesday*

They Grumble on a Thursday too

They Grumble on a Friday, Saturday, Sunday

They Grumble the whole week through.

Many in the world today are not satisfied with their luxurious home or car. But here is

what the Apostle Paul says to us in **I Tim 6: 6-8** "***But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content***". Lack of contentment will make us strive for more of the worldly things. We could learn to be content with what we have and seek to serve the Lord in the best way we can with our gifts of time, talent and treasure and this will bring great joy to us, and glorify God and be a blessing to others.

The Lord heard the murmurings of the children of Israel. He then rained manna from heaven with which they could bake cakes and eat. Even though they were told to collect twice as much on the 6th day as there will be no manna on the 7th day being the Sabbath, they went out on the 7th day to look for it and there was no manna as the Lord told them. God also told them not to collect more than days need on other days, but some did and the following day it had bred worms. When we disobey God, things do not turn out to be a blessing for us. He also provided quails for meat for them all. They had manna for 40 years. God is so faithful, He never failed to provide manna all those years. The details are recorded in **Ex. 16**. God always has a way for His children in any situation.

When they cried out to God for deliverance from the Egyptians, He did so but they had to wait and depend on God. When they cried to God in the wilderness, He provided food and meat and water to sustain them through the wilderness. Furthermore, Moses testifies in

Deut. 29: 5 *“And I have led you forty years in the wilderness: your clothes are not waxen old upon you, and thy shoe is not waxen old upon thy foot.”* And Nehemiah reminds the remaining Israelites hundreds of years later in **Neh 9: 15, 21** *“And gavest them bread from heaven for their hunger, and broughtest forth water for them out of the rock for their thirst, and promisedst them that they should go in to possess the land which thou hadst sworn to give them. Yea, forty years didst thou sustain them in the wilderness, so that they lacked nothing; their clothes waxed not old, and their feet swelled not.”* I call these 'miracles in the wildernesses.' As you go through such wilderness experiences, you will also notice that there are miracles in your life during the time as you continue to trust God, till He grants you the victory. The 40 years wait in wandering through the wilderness was primarily because of their disobedience to obey God as in **Ps 95: 10, 11** *“Forty years long was I grieved with this generation, and said, It is a people that do err in their heart, and they have not known my ways: Unto whom I swear in my wrath that they should not enter into my rest.”*

If you are passing through a wilderness experience right now, here is a promise from the Lord in **Is. 43: 19** *“Behold I will do a new thing now it shall spring forth, shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.”* What a promise that God offers to an exiled people under difficult circumstances to receive a promise of deliverance. The Lord having provided all their

necessities, He now takes them through a hostile nation, the Amalekites and enables them to be victorious (**Ex 17: 8-16**). With Moses' father-in-law's visit a system of leadership and justice was established (**Ex 18**). The Lord then gives the children of Israel a wonderful promise in **Ex 19: 4-6** *“Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself. Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then ye shall be a peculiar treasure unto me above all people: for all the earth is mine: And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel.”*

This is God's promise in **Is 43:19** *“Behold I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.”*

This was a wonderful promise to the children of Israel who had gone through 400 years of slavery. The power of God to deliver them was a great hope. Do you find yourself in a desert place, or in a wilderness seeking to be delivered from your difficult situation? Do not fear for God is a promise keeper and as you trust Him, may He lead you out of your situation and deliver you. In the above verse, God promises “a way through the wilderness.” God is the One who can make rivers in a dry and thirsty land so that the land becomes fruitful. Give Him all the glory for He is a Deliverer from all difficult situations.

Now, Peter in his first epistle speaks of heavenly inheritances to those who have put their trust in the Lord Jesus as their Saviour. He then goes on to talk about Christian growth in **I Pt 2** and calls on them to (1) put away all malice (2) to put away all guilt (3) to put away all hypocrisies (4) to put away all envy and (5) to put away all evil speaking. He then calls on them to use the word of God in their lives as solid food, to experience Christian growth, for He has called us to be as in **I Pt 2: 9, 10** ***“But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light: Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy.”*** Notice that these words of Peter are similar to what God told the children of Israel, but now the promise is extended to both Jews and Gentiles who put their trust in Jesus as their Saviour. This is a wonderful and merciful and gracious God that we worship. Let us give all praise to Him for He is worthy to be praised. An old chorus put it this way:

*“My Lord knows the way
through the wilderness
All I have to do is to follow
Strength for today, is mine always,
And all I have for tomorrow.
My Lord knows the way through
the wilderness
All I have to do is to follow.”*

OVERCOMING GIANTS

Even as David had to face a giant (Goliath) while he was still young of age, so will we be faced with giant-like situations. These giants that come against us are too big for us to face. David faced a physical giant. Today, most of our warfare are spiritual in nature. Let us take a quick look at what the Bible has to say about this.

In **Dan. 10: 10-14** is a glimpse of an angel that Daniel saw. He had been fasting and praying to the Lord for about 21 days before the angel of the Lord appeared. Daniel then heard from the Lord. The Lord sent an angel to speak with Daniel. Notice what the angel said to Daniel in **Dan. 10: 12-13**. The angel was fighting a battle against a demon known as “the prince of Persia”. He needed to get help from Michael, the archangel. The angel in this instance was dressed in battle gear. Notice in verses 5-6 ***“Then I lifted up mine eyes, and looked, and behold a certain man clothed in linen, whose loins were girded with fine gold of Uphaz: His body also was like the beryl, and his face as the appearance of lightning, and his eyes as lamps of fire, and his arms and his feet like in colour to polished brass, and the voice of his words like the voice of a multitude.”***

This is why the apostle Paul when writing to the church in Ephesus, emphasizes the importance for Christians to be equipped with the whole armour of God in **Eph. 6: 10-18**. Being armoured like this will help us to stand up to the 'wiles of the devil'. Paul through experience knew the enemy well enough to

counter Satan's demonic acts. There are several (5) defensive weapons, which are (1) truth – believing in Jesus and His words, because He is Truth, (2) righteousness – displaying the fruit of the Spirit (**Gal. 5: 22, 23**), (3) gospel of peace – standing firmly on the gospel of the Lord Jesus in faith, (4) faith – trusting God in all things, (5) salvation – being a saved (born again) Christian and the two offensive weapons are, The word of God and Prayer. Notice also the description of the enemy's tactics in verses 11 and 12. We need to be more than conquerors as the scripture says and not be overcome by the giants that confront us. Knowing this, that as Jesus promises that He is always with us no matter what we are going through.

The Lord has not failed to equip those who trust Him as in **II Cor. 10: 3-5** ***“For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh:(For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;And having in a readiness to revenge all disobedience, when your obedience is fulfilled.”*** Jesus has enlisted us as His soldiers to fight against the evils of this world through His strength, as in **II Tim. 2: 4** ***“Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.”***

THROUGHOUT OUR LIFE

As we pass through this life we are confronted with trials and difficulties and temptations and Satan himself through all of the worldly things that can easily draw us away from the Lord. The apostle Paul went through a lot of persecution and trials and difficulties, but he is faithful in carrying out His Master's will through it all. He summarizes it this way in **Rom. 8: 35, 36** ***“Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.”*** His confidence is in the Lord, in that Jesus makes “intercession for us” and because He is on our side, we can fight these battles and “be more than conquerors through Him who loved us.”

CONCLUSION

You may be going through a storm or facing giants or through a wilderness but let us remember that God knows the way to lead us. Abraham did not know where He was going, but, his constant Guide was God Himself who called Him out to follow Him. We read in **Ps. 23** that the Shepherd leads His flock faithfully through pastures, valleys and rocky mountainous terrain. Jesus promises to always be there to guide us into paths of righteousness and refreshment. And when we falter and fall – He is there to gather us into His arms. Never failing us in any situation. May we put our trust in Him all the days of our lives. The apostle Paul concludes thus, in **Rom. 8: 38-39** ***“For I am***

persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

EDITORIAL

In the sweet name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, we extend our heartfelt greetings on behalf of SaththiyaVaarthai magazine.

The LORD recompense thy work, and a full reward be given thee of the LORD God of Israel, under whose wings thou art come to trust (Ruth 2:12).

A man named Elimelech, due to a famine in the land of Judah, went to live in the country of Moab with his wife Naomi and their two sons. Shortly after arriving there, Elimelech died. His two sons married Moabite women—one named Orpah and the other named Ruth. After about ten years, both sons also died. Orpah left her mother-in-law Naomi and returned to her own people, but Ruth was unwilling to part from Naomi. She said, "Your God will be my God," and returned with Naomi from Moab to Bethlehem. There, Ruth gleaned leftover grain in the fields of a man named Boaz, who was a relative of Elimelech. Boaz recognized Ruth's

good character and married her. They had a child named Obed. Obed became the father of Jesse, and Jesse became the father of David.

"Bethlehem" means "house of bread." Moab was born with improper and sinful relationships, and it was a land filled with wickedness and abominations. When there was a famine in Judah, Elimelech looked at the temporary situation and left the land of the Lord to go to Moab. As a result, all the men in his family died, and his family line was cut off. Likewise, in our times of difficulty, we often tend to move away from the Lord. When we stop praying, neglect reading the Word, lose faith, and begin to grumble, we slowly drift away from God and lose the blessings He has given us. Naomi heard that the Lord had visited His people and provided for them, so she returned from Moab to Bethlehem. God blessed her family line through Boaz, and from that lineage came King David because she returned to the place of the Lord.

In the same way, in a parable told by Jesus Christ, there were two sons. The younger of them took his share of the inheritance from his father and went to a distant country, where he squandered all his wealth by living a reckless life. A famine arose in that land. He ended up working in the fields feeding pigs. He longed to eat the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything. Then he came to his senses and returned to his father's house. While he was still a long way off, his father saw him, ran to him, embraced him, and kissed him. The father gave him a ring, fine clothes, and sandals, and rejoiced. In the same way, let us not hastily make independent decisions and stray from a blessed life due to the circumstances of our time. Instead, let us understand the will of God, live accordingly, and receive His blessings.

“And rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the LORD your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil” (Joel 2:13).

The annual fasting prayer meeting of IBT was held at the Coimbatore IBT centre on the 9th and 10th of May. On the morning of the 9th, in the first session, Rev. From the 26th to the 30th of the same month, a New Testament checking work in the Siddi language was conducted at BSI, Bangalore. Translator Brother Prakash participated in this work.

In the upcoming Logos camp, it has been decided to release the Bible, New Testament, Psalms, and Proverbs in several languages, and the work is currently underway. We are praying that the Lord will bless you and your family abundantly from His fullness.

WORLD NEWS

1. Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost (69), from the United States, was elected as the 267th leader of the Catholic Church during a meeting of cardinals held at the Vatican on May 8th.
2. In an Indian military operation, 40 Pakistani soldiers were killed.
3. Indian Army Chief Upendra Dwivedi has granted full authority to army commanders to deliver appropriate retaliation if Pakistani forces violate the ceasefire agreement and initiate attacks.
4. In Canada's new cabinet, Anita Anand of Indian origin has been appointed as Foreign Minister, and Maninder Sidhu as Minister of International Trade. Additionally, Randeep Sarai, also of Indian descent, has been appointed Secretary of the Department of International Development.
5. The United States has firmly stated that a nuclear agreement with Iran will only proceed if the country stops supporting armed groups operating as shadow armies in the Middle East.
